Lesson Helps

The following suggestions are given with a view to using these passages in Luke as an aid in Exeter Chapel's "year of prayer." Choose from among the following ideas, or come up with your own, but, in any event, use Luke's continuing account of Jesus' ministry in Galilee as a springboard for in-class prayer!

- Luke 6:12-16. Follow Jesus' example and pray for God to prepare and appoint his leaders for the ministry of Exeter Chapel both now and in the future.
- The Sermon on the Plain (Lk. 6:17-49). Study the moral instruction of Christ in this passage. Then lead your class in a time of confession of sin and petition for the Spirit's help in following this pattern of life.
- Luke 7:1-17. Pray for the sick among us and those who have recently lost loved ones.
- Luke 7:18-35. Contrast the respective ministries of John the Baptist and Jesus. God works through different men, at different times and places, and in different ways. Pray for the Lord to use the variety of gifts in his people to meet the needs of both church and society.
- Luke 7:36-50. Observe how Jesus forgives the worst of sinners. Pray for unsaved people in your circle of influence, in your town and neighborhood, in our state. Invite any unsaved students in your class to come to Jesus in prayer for forgiveness.
